


All hands on deck literacy training coupled with quality student support

All HS students have access to high interest and high impact enriched school options




NMPED Mission


Systemic Approach to Teaching and Learning


- Learning requires culture and feedback










Mapping Project

What do **WE** mean by innovation?

Unique: The program/practice is different in some way from what is most commonly done, or applies something old in a new context.

Hopeful: There is some evidence that the program/practice is making a positive difference for students--even if the evidence is anecdotal.

Locally Informed: Some aspect of the program/practice or its implementation has been designed based on local input, culture, and context.

Equitable: The program/practice addresses or corrects for inequity, and is accessible to communities or individuals who have limited access to resources.




